When you walk in, you are instantly greeted by a wall of water.

"The atmosphere here really takes us over the edge. People have been coming in here saying 'We've needed this for years,'" says General Manager Jesse Limon. □

A wood beam ceiling and Japanese archways hover over guests as they dine beneath a twinkling night sky. Under your feet, leaves are etched into the tile.

A stylish bar occupies a corner of the restaurant which features three different kitchens: teppanyaki rooms with numerous grills, a large, fresh sushi bar, and a line kitchen. But if you're not a fan of sushi don't worry, they have chicken dinners, steak, duck, salmon, cod, and much more.

As for prices, Soho runs the gamut when it comes to cost. Anything from a \$7 appetizer to \$35 dinners. Whatever your price range, you're bound to find something; if you're on a budget, you can still have a great meal.

Aside from sampling some sushi, I headed over to have dinner in the teppanyaki room. Some of the staff joined me around the grill for a dinner which was complete with fire, shrimp, chicken, and steak (I'm not a fan of beef, but I must say it was quite yummy).

Ahi tuna was also on the menu as was the 'Oceans 11,' a giant boat-full of sashimi and sushi and spicy tuna rolls, which feeds a lot of people and runs about \$55.

However, I was told the mob lobster roll is heavenly so had to try it. It is a lobster tail in rice wrapped with fresh slices of regular tuna, mango, white tuna, and salmon and topped with caviar.

Soho Japanese Bistro is more than just sushi; it's a taste, a visual and overall experience for the senses with one goal in mind.

Over the years I've eaten at Japanese/Sushi places from New York and L.A. to Miami and Hawaii, and Soho ranks up there with one of my favorites.
